BRAIN TUMOUR SURVIVOR BOOK RELAUNCH

Claire Bullimore was diagnosed with a rare brain tumour, an Intraventricular Meningioma, in 2008 - aged just 25. She was operated on two days later.

Redundancy then followed in 2010 as she was considered unfit for both part-time and full-time work. Claire had been left with several postoperative complications including quadrantanopia hemianopia (brain damage), vision loss, seizure medication, memory loss, speech deficit and crippling anxiety.

She has spent years having rehabilitation for speech, cognitive and physical therapy.

Fast forward to the present day and Claire is now a leading advocate for the brain tumour community. She is a blogger and speaker. She raised over £5,000 via a crowdfunding campaign for her book tour and visited 17 cities across the UK, flying in the face of myriad post-surgical disabilities. Her hub on Facebook, founded in 2011, has a loyal following of 16k+ members.

Claire has new chapters to her book 'A Brain Tumour's Travel Tale: Cards On The Table - I Pooed Myself' which originally came out in 2012. It gives the exact footprint of how she reaches goals after having brain surgery. There are tons of examples for people to use for their own journey.
